

## **BRENTWOOD SCIENCE MAGNET SCHOOL FAIR**

It seems we were featuring engines made in Michigan this year since Joe Siddons brought his 1 hp. Gray Motor Company engine made in Detroit, Bob Smith brought his Bean orchard sprayer pump which is powered by an engine tagged "The Sprayer Engine" but is obviously a Novo Type S engine made in Lansing and Larry Evans brought a 1-3/4 hp. air cooled engine sold by United Engine Co. also of Lansing.

This small group of engines actually turned out to be a good educational mix of engines since Joe's Gray broke a part of the governor mechanism and became a good static display

that we could easily point out the various bits and pieces, demonstrate how the hit and miss latching device works, etc. The United air cooled ran well all day with no sign of the fuel system problems of the last couple of years so we could demonstrate the hit and miss governing by putting a load on the flywheel to make it fire more often. Bob's engine became a good demonstration of engine starting and troubleshooting procedures since he appeared to have some ongoing ignition and carburetion problems.

Even with our limited display there seemed to be a lot of general interest and much appreciation shown by the event organizers.




