

### This old iron By Bob Smith

### 1909 Aermotor owned by Ken Evans

This engine was built by the Aermotor Company of Chicago, Illinois, and was mainly used as a backup on their windmills they sold. This was a unique 8 cycle model where it fired once on the first



four strokes and then coasts for the other four. Ken heard of this rare engine in Northern California from a friend in Saugus. Ken contacted the owner and bought the engine sight unseen. What makes the engine rare is the fly ball governor off the cam shaft. The owner agreed to bring the engine to a show in Sacramento where he met a man who took it home to Bakersfield where Ken went to pick it up. If you have ever seen this magnificently restored engine you would not believe the condition it was in when he bought it. The engine was totally rusted, piston stuck, and all shafts were frozen. The mixer, gas tank, and exhaust were missing. Ken bought the mixer and exhaust through an add in Gas Engine Magazine. To remove the piston. Ken made a cover plate and used hydraulic fluid to apply pressure to the top of the piston. Once totally disassembled and cleaned, Ken began to reassemble the engine only to find the crankshaft was bent. With much frustration, Ken put the engine away for 1 year.

Ken finally found someone to straighten the crank shaft and finished reassembling the engine. Since it was originally designed for pumping water, Ken made a wood water pump with a plexiglas front so you can see the actual inner workings of the pump. The first time Ken ran the engine was at the 1989 George Cross show and used a rubber band as a governor spring. In 1992 Ken bought a limited edition casting kit and machined and built a 3/8 scale of the same engine. The major machining was done by Dave Holzberger.


