Greg is owner of many engines, his latest purchase being the very finely restored 3 HP John Deere which was owned by our member, the late Frank Moody.


Greg's buddies tell me he collects Harley Davidson motorcycles and Cushman scooters.

Remember the rather new member in the last issue who furnished his low bed tractor/trailer to carry the Gleaner combine from the Stuber complex to our site at Cal Poly? Well, what we didn't report at the time was that he, Gregg Stires, donated and delivered to WAPA a 1930's John Deere threshing machine on that same day.



This photo shows how well preserved it is, even though he found it hidden within some tall brush at an apple orchard on the Lone Pine Canyon Road going to Wrightwood. The sifter/shakers are in incredibly good condition, all bearings are tight, and it has not been converted to rubber tires as most of them have been. The round steel spokes are original. With some tender refurbishing, the fiber pulleys will again do their job.



If you still don't know who Gregg is, take note of the photo of him beside his newly purchased 3 HP John Deere engine. That engine is none other than the immaculately restored engine which was the pride and joy of our late member, Frank Moody. Gregg had it on display at the Highland Spring Festival. Many of our displayers were heard to say they never got a chance to sit down because there were so many friendly spectators with so many questions. Also being busy made the time go by very fast.









Answering yours of the 20th inst., relative to membership in the Educational Committee:

I will be pleased to do what I can in this connection. although as I told Mr. Austin I have not much time, especially evenings, but I realize the necessity of making this a success, and appreciate the fact that you will have to use extraordinary efforts to bring the educational department up to the standard set by the splendid plant into which they are going.
