

Remembering Jim Cook, July 31, 1949 to August 31, 2014 By Tom Millett

A man with great talent and love of adventure, Jim was born in the outskirts of Miami, Florida, to parents who had two boys and one girl. Unfortunately Jim's dad was called to the Korean War and perished as a POW, never to see his son. His Mom moved the family to Savannah, Georgia, when Jim was very young, and it was not until about 1959–60 when they moved on to arrive in Rowland Heights, California. There is only about one year difference in the ages of the three children and they attended Rowland School District schools.

Jim became a great welder and applied his talents well. For about eight years, he worked for our very own WAPA member, the late Bob Helm, at his demolition business. There, one of his more innovating and interesting jobs was lengthwise cutting of fuel storage tanks removed from demolished gas stations and fabricating them into trailers. Moving on he applied his skills at Glen Dorning Co. until in 2002 he was accepted by the City of Los Angeles to work at the truck maintenance yard as a welder. He had plans to retire from there in January, 2015, and move to Arizona.

Many club members may not have known of Jim's adventurous pleasures. He was an avid outdoors man. He thoroughly enjoyed going to the hiking trails, camping and applying his skills at doing four wheel drive antics out in the desert. He owned a boat on Lake Powell and immensely enjoyed going there and exploring the many coves around the lake. Jim joined WAPA in 1998. Probably he picked up the interest when working for Bob Helm. He saved every issue of the Hit"N"Miss. Although he often didn't have the time to attend WAPA functions and shows, he is remembered as having an upright 3HP Novo. At shows he attended, he would devilishly squirt oil into the vertical exhaust pipe of his hit & miss Novo. When the engine fired, it would emit large perfectly shaped smoke rings.

WAPA sends the family our sincere condolences over the loss of Jim. Their loss is indeed our loss.
