It was Monday morning after the Cal Poly Pumpkin Festival and we were preparing to move the tractors back to the tractor shop. We prepared the John Deere D for starting by turning on the gas, turning on the kill switch, opening the compression releases on both cylinders, and setting to full choke. I pulled the flywheel over a few times and it started. I closed the compression release on cylinder 1 and went around to close cylinder 2 and noticed it was not firing through the petcock. Don Young drove it back to the tractor show on one cylinder and we planned for the following weekend to work on it. We started by removing number 2 spark plug and found it was wet. We checked the compression and found there was no problem with stuck valves. We put the spark plug back in and held the

wire a gap from the plug to check for a spark. There was no spark. Leroy followed the wire back to the magneto and found that someone had pulled the wire out while it was over at the show. We inserted the wire and started the tractor and let it run for a few minutes to make sure everything was operating properly.

Loading and Unloading

RAMPS: Correct length, width and weight for the equipment that you will be loading and unloading. Secured so they will not slip or tip.



WINCH: Check before use, cable, hook, securely mounted to the truck or trailer. Do not exceed the capacity of the winch, three full turns of cable on the drum, do not use the winch to secure the load, stand clear, keep spectators away, wear gloves, place a heavy blanket on the cable to help prevent whiplash in case the cable breaks, never attach the hook back onto the cable, a safety chain attached to the load and to the trailer in case of winch failure, never place the cable on top of the drum. Use a shackle or strap at the anchor point.

TRACTORS: Allow them to warm up before driving up the ramps. Many accidents happen when the tractor is not running well, then, partially up the ramps it suddenly runs well and flips over backwards.
