#### My Sattley By Bob Smith

This will be a 7 part series published monthly covering the finding of the engine up to the first startup after restoration. I call the first part "The Find".

Back in January of 2010, I was scanning through Craig's List and came across a Hit-n-miss engine a guy was selling rather cheap. I was curious and emailed him about setting up a time to see it. By the picture it appeared to be a 1 1/2hp. The next day the man emailed me his phone number and address. That weekend I picked up my friend Frank Long and headed to Perris in my truck where the guy lived. The man was in the roofing business and had a large piece of land. He directed us to the back where the engine was sitting out in the elements. As I got to the engine I could tell it was much larger than a 1 1/2hp. The engine was pretty rusty with no visible signs of paint or markings. There was an aluminum name plate on the front of the water hopper which read:

Sattley HP 5 Speed 430 No 7623 Montgomery Ward Co. Satisfaction Guaranteed or Your Money Back World-Wide Distributors of Quality Merchandise



I checked the engine over and found no cracks in the cylinder or head. The magneto and ignitor was missing along with the drip oiler, one grease cup on the crank shaft cap and a grease cup on the piston connecting rod. One flywheel governing weight had a finger broken where it connected to the throwout bearing. Surprisingly the cast iron crank cover was inside the water hopper and the piston was free. The head appeared to have been taken off at some time because one head nut was missing and one stud was missing (not broken). This was more iron than I planned on but I could not pass it up. I paid the man and asked if he had any means of lifting this engine into my truck. He had a hydraulic lift cart that might work. We rocked the engine off the ground and onto his cart. I backed the truck up to the engine and we pumped the hydraulic cart up to the height of the tail gate. We slid the engine onto the bed of my truck, strapped it down and headed home. At home, Frank and I rocked the engine onto a 4 wheel furniture dolly and rolled it down a set of ramps to its new home on the side of my garage.

Next month we will go into the tear down of the engine.
