TRACTOR SHOP UPDATE

December and January has been a very busy 2 months at the tractor shop. The hay rides we participated in for 2018 took a toll on the old tractors we were using so it was decided to bring them up to safe and reliable rolling stock. We were to tackle them 1 by 1 and order parts were needed to get them in shape. We started with the 1948 John Deere A that we painted. The magneto cap, rotor, and points were replaced in October. Both brakes were removed and Ron Haskell took them home and cleaned

them up with no new parts needed. The clutch was completely removed and rebuilt with new parts. It was a chore getting it back on but Bob Holman finally figured it out. The generator was removed and taken to Phil Sigmon for bench testing and found we needed a new regulator. Ron and Jim Treadwell set the timing and adjusted the valve gap. All we have left is to get the lights working and that tractor is ready to pull happy people. When we started on the JD A we discovered that the 1946 John Deere A with the sickle mower had a bad radiator leak. Joe Siddons, Bob Holman, and Dan Kato disassembled the tractor to remove the radiator. Tom Millett mentioned that was the reason his family had red tractors

> rather than green ones. The top and bottom castings were removed from the core and new parts were ordered. I took the shutters home to sand blast them and Ron took over to repair and paint. Ron also took the castings home to remove 3 broken bolts. Not bad considering that this was probably the original radiator and there are close to 35 bolts holding it all together. The new radiator core and bolt kit are here so we

will begin to reassemble the tractor. Next Tom Millett, Dan Kato, and Joe Siddons removed the head on the 1931 John Deere D that had a water leak into number 1 cylinder. The gasket set is on order. The 1953 John Deere 50 that Dave Matias put new rear tires on was gone through and parts were ordered for it. Hay rides start in April so we have plenty of time to get 3 or 4 good running tractors. —Bob Smith
