Robert "Bob" DeVoe 1930 – 2020

A Tribute by Ken Evans

I have known Bob DeVoe for a long time. Maybe close to 70 years. I was the tag along or was it drag along little brother. My oldest brother, Carroll, Jr., was a best friend of Bob. They were the same age and had similar interests. Which was self built solid propellant rockets. We would go to Bob's house in Glendale, CA, and help build them. Then they would go to the Mojave desert and launch them. But to newer WAPA members, he was not known. He was active in the club in the 1980's having been Vice President in 1988. Bob introduced me to hit and miss engines. He had seen an engine exhibit at a fair and while visiting friends in northern California, he came home with an engine. It was a Bulldog, ignitor ignition and hit and miss. He gave it to me to figure out. I knew nothing about them and as an Electronics Engineer I tried to make them more complicated than they were. But I did have engine knowledge from working on cars. I did figure out that it was missing the lever to actuate the ignitor.

I worked at the Jet Propulsion Lab in Pasadena and told friends about this strange piece of machinery. Some one brought me a newspaper article about a man in Monrovia with an antique engine. It was Lamar Dixon and the engine was an Olds auto engine mounted on a trailer. I tracked him down and found out there was this Pasadena based engine club called Western Antique Power Associates. I went to a meeting and mentioned I needed information about a Bulldog engine. Sitting across from me was a member with the same engine. I was able to visit him at his house in Highland Park and make measurements of the ignitor trip lever. With that information I was able to build it at Bob's well equipped home machine shop. That engine still needs to be restored to running condition. Why not before, that is a long story.

Bob is probably best known in WAPA for designing and building with help from Dick Pridham, a portable work bench with roof to be used at WAPA shows, Bob called it a Blacksmith Shop. But it was modular and "easily" transported. It was used at Knott's Berry Farm shows and L. A. County Fair. It is a real jigsaw to assemble. The pieces are marked but trying to figure out the sequence is a challenge. Jim Davis can attest to that. The shop still exists and is being stored at my brother Larry's house in Arcadia. I have talked with the family and it will be donated to WAPA.

To the very end Bob maintained a complete machine shop and wood working tools. I will miss his knowledge and generosity in teaching me machining skills and complete use of his shop. Thank you.
