Call to Order: President Bob Smith called the meeting to order at 9:02 AM

Flag Salute: Led by LeRoy Overstreet

**President:** Bob Smith welcomed all in attendance and encouraged the membership to participate in the discussions. President Smith addressed the issue of continued criticism by a few members and reminded everyone that the Board of Directors is comprised solely of volunteers and that consideration should be given to this fact. Any member that feels they could or would do a better job should volunteer for office in the next election. A discussion on mailing out WAPA pins determined that any member requesting a pin that lives out of state will receive a pin, and that all others requesting a pin that are unable to attend a meeting or make other arrangements include \$4.00 to cover postage. WAPA sign-ups for the spring field trips may be cancelled if the schools cancel field trips.

Vice President: Carey Stockton announced that the Tulare Show is on hold pending further notification.

**Secretary:** Dave Stockton made a motion to approve the minutes of the Board of Directors meeting held on February 1, 2020, seconded by Kelley Garcia with all in favor, and entered into record without correction.

**Treasurer**: Kelley Garcia furnished the banking report as follows: February figures for the investment savings account report a balance at \$40,580.63, museum fund at \$163,383.13, total investments at \$203,963.76, with an adjusted profit/loss of -\$5,166.15. Total income/expenses were \$6,252.77. Checking acct. balance at \$8,094.53. Kelley moved 25% of gross profits (\$2,010.00) from the brokerage savings account into the museum fund account per Bylaws.

**Membership**: David Pasillas furnished the membership report as follows: total membership at 162, with 125 as active, dues-paying. Motion made to approve for membership Dave Foley and David Reid, seconded by Dave Stockton with all in favor. Motion made to drop 27 from membership for non-payment of dues, seconded by Joe Siddons with all in favor.

**Purchasing:** Lance Wilson has WAPA shirts and hats for sale. The Burgers & Bullets Shoot-out is on Sat. May 16 - if you wish to go, contact Lance at 909 856-5500

**Show Director:** Roger Hahn absent. President Bob Smith gave a report on the following upcoming shows: The Highland Citrus Festival on March 19 has been cancelled; LaVerne Car Show on April 11 has been postponed with new date to be announced; Tulare show is on hold pending further notification; Chino Corn Feed Run on April 25 has been postponed - motion to sanction by Bob Smith, second by Carey Stockton with all in favor, date to be announced; L.A. Live Steamers has invited WAPA to participate with them on Sunday, April 26 - motion to sanction by Ron Haskell, seconded by Kelley Garcia with all in favor.

# THE ANSWER TO THE HIT AND MISS JOHN DEERE

1938

**Econmy tractor** 

I was at the Flaybob show and I noticed Ron Davis was showing an unusual looking tractor which I thought someone had modified and put an Economy engine on it. With further review, it didn't look modified but purpose built with the engine. I will reprint the information Ron has on his sign describing the tractor.

With catalog sales down across the board, Sears Roebuck and Co. was looking to broaden their line of farm equipment offerings with a full sized tractor. Sears had reached out to several manufacturers regarding the production of a private label tractor to be sold by Sears, but found little interest, with the exception of John Deere who had agreed to work with Sears to develop a few test tractors. Coincidently, a boxcar load of Economy farm engines bound for Visalia, CA, were lost in March of 1927 and located some 2,000 miles away on a storage track in Gloster, LA and was subsequently returned to the Sears Evansville, IN plant. However, by this time Sears had closed out their farm engine lines and the Evansville plant had been completely converted to the production of Servel home refrigerators. Faced with this newfound surplus of farm engines with no market, Sears asked John Deere to incorporate these engines in the design of the Sears Economy Tractor. The first of four prototype 7-21 test tractors rolled off of the John Deere production line in late September, 1938, and all were quickly shipped to Sears for testing in the outskirts of Chicago, IL. With winter fast approaching, Sears immediately put these four units to work in the Garbanzo bean fields of Oswego. While the performance of the tractor was deemed adequate for belt work, problems with operation of the tractor in the field soon proved too numerous to continue without further refinement. Sears parked the tractors for the winter with intentions of initiating a rework in the spring of 1939, but funding for the program was cut. Somehow one of the four prototype test tractors escaped the scrap drives of WWII, where it sat abandoned until the site was developed in 1967. This tractor was restored by a collector in Niwot, CO, and was acquired by Ron Davis in 2019. Ron is the great grandson of Cletus Elmer Davis, chief engineer for the Sears 7-21 Economy project.

Ron saw this tractor at a show in Colorado in the mid 90's and fell in love with it. He had been trying to track it down ever since and finally in April found it in a barn in Yucaipa and bought it. The 7-21 designation means 7hp at the belt pulley and 21hp on the draw bar. The engine is a 7hp Economy setup to run in reverse.




