

Most of the fun stuff of working on the engine has been completed, now it's details to the outside of the building. The current project for the WERT (Western Engine Restoration Team) is to put a six foot wide board sidewalk across the front of the building. We started by digging out an area where the sidewalk would go including trenches for railroad ties that will support the planks. It was a real circus to get the ties straight and level but after a couple of work parties we got it reasonably close. Our next work day should finish the project by screwing down the 2x6 planks. To give the wood a vintage look we are burning it with a propane weed burner torch that should also preserve it somewhat against the elements.

Once this is complete the next project would be to cover the front of the building with used corrugated tin from the old original building and attaching a six foot wide roof across the front to cover the sidewalk. Hopefully within the next few months we will be able to have another open house for WAPA members to come out and check out the new look



SAFETY NOTES FROM TIMOTHY NEELY

24402. Auxiliary Driving and Passing Lamps

(a) Any motor vehicle may be equipped with not to exceed two auxiliary driving lamps mounted on the front at a height of not less than 16 inches nor more than 42 inches. Driving lamps are lamps designed for supplementing the upper beam from headlamps and may not be lighted with the lower beam.

(b) Any motor vehicle may be equipped with not to exceed two auxiliary passing lamps mounted on the front at a height of not less than 24 inches nor more than 42 inches. Passing lamps are lamps designed for supplementing the lower beam from headlamps and may also be lighted with the upper beam.
